GET TO KNOW YOUR MEMBERS

Celebrating 50 years in Australia By Eva Wiland

This year, I will celebrate the 50th anniversary of my arrival in Australia – an anniversary I share with the official opening of Sydney Opera House on October 20, 1973, by Queen Elizabeth II.

The day of my departure from Bergen, Norway, winter came early, leaving a 10cm snow cover as a pristine white farewell as I boarded my flight to London. The next day I picked up my long-haul BOAC flight (otherwise known as 'Better On A Camel') to Sydney.

My then fiancé, Edward, who was from Chile and who I had met in Geneva three years earlier, had sent me a one-way ticket to Sydney. My flight had stopovers in Zurich, Bahrain, Bangkok, Hong Kong and Darwin before arriving in brilliant early summer weather 48 hours later at Mascot Airport.

I found Australia very different to what I was used to – with a culture something between British (everyone drinking tea) and American (drive-in cinema). I was not homesick for Norway because I had already lived away for seven years in Paris, London, Geneva and Marbella, Spain and had travelled extensively throughout Europe, but I missed the cosmopolitan culture with its art, cafes, museums and historical buildings.

However, I soon became a busy wife and later stay-at-home mum of two boys, Francis and Thomas, 18 months apart. We first lived in North Ryde and later bought a house in Asquith. I found new friends and came to love the Australian lifestyle, its friendly people and the climate.

It was 14 years before I returned to Norway, as an Australian citizen, when the whole family travelled to Europe. When we got back and I looked down at Sydney harbour from the plane, I was happy to 'call Australia home'. By this time, I had finished my university studies at Macquarie University with a BA in English and Mass Communication and was about to start my career in journalism.

In the late 1970s, I had been invited by a Norwegian friend to join her as volunteer broadcaster of the Norwegian program on Ethnic Radio 2EA. I

was involved as the station developed to become part of SBS, which led me to enrol at Macquarie University.

With a BA behind me, I started my journalist career as casual subeditor on the business pages of The Australian, working evening shifts from 3-11pm. They were difficult hours to work while looking after a family. A few years later, it came to a stage when I had to choose between career and family.

I ended up choosing a career and progressed as news editor for a business publisher, where I worked for 13 years. During this period, I kept a close relationship with my two sons as they achieved university degrees, started successful careers, got married and gave me four adorable grandsons.

It was also at this time, I met my second husband, Murray, who like me was a journalist. We lived in Artarmon and worked together for 16 years. Every year, we were sent on assignment to report from international conferences and expositions in the South-East Asia, the USA and Europe.

In 2002, we decided to start our own editorial business. Sadly, Murray passed away three years later. I continued our business until I was offered a position as editor at Reuters. Before its time, I was able to work remotely in my new job. Reuters let me travel and work from overseas during winter while it was summer in Europe plus report from an annual international congress in Monte Carlo until I retired in 2019.

That was the year I met Adrian, who's now my closest friend. We enjoy sailing on a 34ft yacht on Pittwater, in which he has time share. We have enjoyed travelling together in Greece, the UK, Malta and Norway plus short trips around Australia like Lake Eyre when it had water. Apart from travelling and sailing, I enjoy the arts, cooking and wine appreciation, while Adrian likes reading and keeping fit.
