GUEST SPEAKER

Warren Fahey is a cultural historian, prolific author, performer and occasional ABC 'talking head'. He has been honoured with the Order of Australia, Prime Minister's Centennial Medal, Advance Australia Award and the Nation's highest award for lifetime achievement in music, The Don Banks Music Award. He prefers to say he is a graduate of the Dingo University.

He will talk about the "Dead and Buried" of Sydney's three earliest burial grounds. In digging up Sydney's early history Warren Fahey relates tales of notable burials and the good, the bad and the ugly of Sydney city. The illustrated talk is also a comment on changing attitudes to death, especially in the nineteenth and early twentieth century.
