

Members News! <u>14 day WA Spring Wildflower Tour (Judy Slatyer)</u>

In October 2023, Jenny Quirke & I, went on a bus tour beginning from Perth. The route was as far as Kalbarri, then inland to Dalwallinu, heading south to Wave Rock towards Albany and Margaret River and return to Perth.

Wonderful sights were the Pinnacles in the Nambung National Park 200km north of Perth & Wave Rock, a granite cliff 15 metres high & 110 metres long which was a majestic sight resembling a wave.



The nearby town of Hyden though isolated has an active prominent profile of the Mouritz family supporting the community. They support medical services, the airport, the motel we stayed at, a caravan park, numerous farmlands and commercial ventures such as lace museums, vintage farm machines, cars, and cafes. Their wildflower garden was reclaimed from farmland and took 15 years to restore. Shenagh, a descendant, with her dog came on board the bus to give us a personal tour.

Although we saw flowers it wasn't a great season.

One amusing moment was a pair of crocheting ladies, raising funds for an orphanage in Myanmar, saying **to call them** for flowering season next year, as this year they had suffered a drought, therefore not a good display.

RECIPE



Souvlaki

Souvlaki is a great alternative to sausages or steak for your summer BBQ.

Ingredients:

- 1kg chicken, lamb or pork fillet
- 1 lemon for juicing
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tsp fresh oregano, chopped or
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- 2 tsp fresh mint, chopped
- 1 tsp dried mint
- Sea salt and freshly grated black pepper to taste.

Preparation:

 Cut meat in cubes and place in a bowl with olive oil, lemon juice, herbs and seasoning. Marinade for at least 30 minutes or overnight.

2. Thread meat on wooden skewers and cook on a hot BBQ for 10 minutes until done. Serve with tzatziki dip, Greek salad *(see below)* and slices of ciabatta bread.

Tzatziki

Ingredients:

- 1 cup grated cucumber
- 1/4 tsp fine sea salt
- 3/4 cup of Greek natural yogurt
- 1tblsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1tblsp freshly chopped mint
- 1/2 tblsp freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 1 clove of garlic, crushed
- Sea salt and freshly grated black pepper to taste.

Preparation:

- 1. Add salt to cucumber and let it stand for 30 minutes.
- 2. Lightly squeeze the grated cucumber between your



palms over the sink to remove excess moisture. 3. Transfer the squeezed cucumber to a serving bowl and stir in the yogurt, olive oil, herbs, lemon juice, garlic and seasoning.

4. Let the mixture rest for five minutes before drizzling it on the souvlaki just before serving. Leftover tzatziki keeps well chilled for about four days.

Greek Salad

Ingredients:

- 2 tomatoes
- 1 Lebanese cucumber
- 1/2 red capsicum
- 1/2 green capsicum
- 1/2 small red onion
- 1 tblsp Kalamata olives, pitted
- Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tblsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1 tblsp freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 150g slab of Fetta
- 2 tsp fresh oregano, chopped
- 2 tblsp parsley, chopped
- Preparation:

 Cut tomatoes in wedges and cucumber in 5mm think slices quartered, cut capsicum in squares, slice onion and add to salad bowl with kalamata olives.

2. Add olive oil and lemon juice with seasoning to

salad and mix well.

3. Top with Fetta and scatter herbs over it with a drizzle of olive oil.
